# First Annual Xeriscape / WaterWise Landscape Contest

#### I. Primary Objectives of Contest

- a) Promote and reward water conservation;
- b) Reduce outdoor irrigation and monthly water bills; and
- c) Encourage responsible, sustainable and beautiful Xeriscapes / WaterWise landscapes.

#### II. Three Categories — Multiple Prizes

#### a) Resident/Homeowner Amateur Landscape Category

Current resident designs, plants and landscapes the Xeriscape / WaterWise garden area(s), thereby self-performing *most* of the work. \*

- 1) First Place: \$500 credit on water bill
- 2) Second Place: \$250 credit on water bill
- 3) Three Honorable Mentions: \$50 credit on water bill

#### b) Resident/Homeowner Professional Landscape Category

Current resident pays one or more professionals to design, plant and landscape the Xeriscape / WaterWise garden area.\*

- 1) First Place: \$500 credit on water bill
- 2) **Second Place:** \$250 credit on water bill
- 3) Three Honorable Mentions: \$50 credit on water bill

#### c) Homeowner Association (HOA) Common Areas Landscape Category

- 1) First Place: \$1,000 credit on HOA water bill
- 2) **Second Place:** \$500 credit on HOA water bill
- 3) Three Honorable Mentions: \$100 credit on HOA water bill

#### III. Contest schedule

#### IV. Contestant Requirements

a) **Customers Only.** Each residential and HOA contestant must be a Castle Pines North Metropolitan District customer. (Though not technically part of our Metropolitan District, the Hidden Pointe residents and HOA are valued customers and welcome to compete.)

- b) **Select one category** in which to compete. (Only one category/entry per residential address and only one entry per HOA.)
- c) **Minimum Square Footage.** Residential contestants must dedicate a *minimum* of 400 square feet *exclusively* to Xeriscape and/or WaterWise landscaping. HOA contestants must dedicate a *minimum* of 25% of the HOA's irrigated common areas <u>or</u> a *minimum* of 5,000 square feet of the HOA's irrigated common areas whichever is greater.
- d) **Submit Contest Entry Form & Photos.** Each contestant must submit to the District the attached Contest Entry Form and 3 to 12 "before" and 3 to 12 "after" photos between **Monday**, **July 1**, **2013** and **Wednesday**, **July 31**, **2013**.

#### VI. Primary Judging Criteria

- a) Use of Xeriscape techniques and WaterWise plants that reduce demand for outdoor watering;
- b) The degree to which Xeriscape / WaterWise area equals or exceeds 400 square feet;
- c) The total square footage reduction/elimination of Kentucky Bluegrass and/or other high-water-use sod/turf;
- d) The number and diversity of Xeriscape and WaterWise seedlings/vegetation integrated into the improved garden area(s); and
- e) Existing and future aesthetic value; to what degree did the contestant:
  - 1) plant beautiful, high-visual-impact Xeriscape and WaterWise vegetation that dispels the notion that Xeriscape / WaterWise gardens are drab and ugly;
  - 2) create a garden area that will convey visual interest and beauty year-round;

- 3) integrate a variety of Xeriscape and/or WaterWise vegetation (trees, shrubs, ornamental grasses, groundcover, flowers, cacti, etc.); and
- 4) utilize height, scale, proportion, texture and color to create beautiful contrasts and aesthetically pleasing Xeriscaping and/or WaterWise landscaping that requires less water.

#### VII. Important Insights & Friendly Advice:

- a) Start planning to plant now! Optimal spring planting season usually runs from May though early June. After early-to-mid June, high temperatures will substantially increase the water required to establish newly planted seeds, seedlings, and transplants.
- b) Participate in our Xeriscape / WaterWise Workshops & Lecture Series at 8:00am at the Castle Pines North Community Center on the 2nd Saturday of each month, from March through September 2013. (Participating may give you a competitive advantage!)
