PLAYGROUNDS OPEN Use At Your Own Risk

Consistent with <u>Section I, Subsection H (2)(a) of the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment's Fifth Amended Public Health Order 20-28</u>, our playgrounds in The Retreat, Coyote Ridge, and Daniels Gate parks are now open. Use the playgrounds at your own risk and on the following conditions:

- 1. Playground users need to bring their own hand sanitizer and apply it immediately before and after touching playground equipment;
- 2. No more than ten people at a time may use each playground; and
- 3. Maintain a minimum six-feet of social distancing.
