Did you know?

- An irrigation system with 60 pounds per square inch of pressure and a leak 1/32nd of an inch in diameter wastes about 6,300 gallons of water per month.
- The American Water Works Association calculates that the average American household uses 180-250 gallons of water each day and loses 14% of that to undetected leakage. A leaking toilet can waste 200 gallons of water per day.
- At 10 drips per minute a leaking faucet or showerhead wastes over 500 gallons a year. That is enough water for 60 dishwasher loads!


